School of Rock. Inspired by the success of its Native American Composer Apprentice Project, the GCMF incorporated the School of Rock (SoR) into its educational programming in 2007. Grand Canyon School of Rock is a fast-paced, week-long education program developed with Grand Canyon Music Festival musicians that gives local high school students the opportunity to experience all aspects of band life.

From intensive rehearsal and music theory sessions focusing on rock and pop music theory, techniques, and styles, to the culminating public performances, School of Rock students share in all aspects of band life, from musicianship, to hauling gear, set-up, promotion, sound & light board and support of band mates.

SoR students compose their own music, and arrange and interpret standards from popular music genres. They are exposed to new music, are introduced to music production, and develop their own performance skills as they learn the discipline of ensemble performance and participation. Students designed the logo and backdrop, created a web page, and intern on production. Grand Canyon School of Rock culminates in 2 public performances of classic rock & roll music
